

IT IS SPRING! THE BIRDS ARE SINGING AND THE BEES ARE.....

If you are stung by a bee, there are some home remedies that will give you some relief. First, you need to pull out the stinger. Next, apply ice or a cold compress for 20 minutes to reduce the swelling. A paste of baking soda and water applied to the sting will draw out some of the venom. If you do not have any antihistamines or itch creams around, a paste of meat tenderizer can provide relief from itching and pain. Other's tout that apple cider vinegar and toothpaste will also relieve your symptoms which can last up to 10 days after being bitten.

WE WENT LOOKING FOR ANSWERS

Recently there were some postings on our Facebook page about open flames on patios, so we went looking for the facts. According to an article in the Columbus Dispatch, fire pits are allowed in Columbus. These are the regulations cited in a July 4th, 2015, article.

- * Use only clean, seasoned firewood or the equivalent.
- * Have a water source or fire extinguisher ready for use. (This can be a bucket of water or a hose.)
- * The fire pit must be always supervised. Be sure the fire is completely extinguished before leaving it unattended.
- * The fire must be contained within the appliance, with no flames extending outside the appliance or screen.
- * Fire pits cannot be used during "air quality" alert days.
- * If there are complaints, the fire may be extinguished. Complaints might include smoke drifting into a house, embers drifting onto an adjacent property and/or the fire getting out of control.

The Ohio Fire Code states, "Charcoal burners and other open-flame cooking devices shall not be operated on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of combustible construction". Open flame cooking includes gas grills and fire pits.

KNOW WHO TO CALL

When to call 911. For serious emergencies. This would include a shooting, a stabbing, or active threat of violence. This is also the number to call if someone is suffering a medical emergency or in case of a fire.

Non-emergency calls. 614-645-4545. Calls that require a police response but are not emergencies. A theft, cars drag racing, vandalism and any time a police report is needed.

311 – report pothole, debris on the street, etc. 614-645-3111 – bulk refuge
