Simple Steps for Disposing of Construction Material

Take simple steps when remodeling to dispose of construction debris whether it's a DIY project or you have contractors. The brown dumpsters are for household waste and not for construction material. Construction material cannot be left on the ground near the dumpsters. If you are using a professional contractor they must dispose of construction debris at an approved dump site. If you are doing a small DIY project be sure that what you are putting in the dumpster is not a hazardous waste. It is especially important to dispose of paint and other construction liquids properly so we do not pollute our waterways.

Wash latex painting tools in an interior sink. Dry out latex paint by thickening it with cat litter. Leave the paint can lid off so trash collectors know it is solid. Dispose of drywall compound as a solid.

UPDATE ON THE FUTURE OF THE TENNIS COURT

At our July 18th community meeting we heard from many owners regarding the issue of repairing or removing the tennis courts on our property. After the meeting we continued to hear from owners who were unable to join the discussion a month ago. The community has made it clear that they want the board to set a path forward with clear timelines. The information we gave to owners included the options of replacing the courts or removing them. Since the courts are listed in the by-laws as an amenity, a 75% affirmative vote of all owners is needed to remove the courts. The board has a contractor who is creating the new plat needed so we can move forward with that process. There is no guarantee that the voting process will produce conclusive results. While the board will not set a definite deadline on the voting, we will not prolong the process. If the ballots go out we see a pattern that indicates that the votes are being split in both ways, the board will move forward and make the decisions necessary to resolve the issues concerning the courts.

The board has recently been made aware that there may be options that were previously not considered. Our management company learned of another property in Columbus where a court with similar cracks was repaired using a new expanding filler. A member of our board plans to visit that court and in addition we have requested a written estimate to see if this process is a possible solution for our court. We are going to use this information to keep pushing forward. We have people in our community with extensive experience in real estate and landscape architecture that are providing their input and expertise on possible other alternatives, and we welcome any others who would like to have a role in getting this done.

Members of the board are volunteers and devote considerable time and energy to the day-to-day issues of OTC. Resolving the tennis court issues requires everyone, both on the board and in the community to work together in finding a speedy, cost-effective, and fair resolution of the outstanding issues. We welcome any help and guidance you would like to offer. We reaffirm our commitment to keep you informed and to pursue new options as they become available.

Spice Cake Recipe

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1/4 tsp. salt

1 tsp. ground Cinnamon

½ tsp. ground Ginger

1/4 tsp. ground Nutmeg

1/4 tsp. ground Cloves

2 large eggs

½ cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup dark brown sugar

1/4 cup canola oil

½ cup unsweetened applesauce

½ cup buttermilk

½ tsp vanilla

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees, Grease an 8 x 8 inch pan. In a large bowl blend all the dry ingredients and set aside. In a medium bowl whisk eggs and both sugars until well combined. Add the applesauce. oil, buttermilk and vanilla and mix Until well combined. Add the wet ingredients to the flour mixture and mix lightly. Pour batter into the greased pan and bake for 30-40 minutes.
